## League of Women Voters of Cook County Guidelines for Reports Originating in Our League

- 1. League of Women Voters of Cook County ("LWVCC") reports are generally proposed, researched and written by LWVCC Committees or Interest Groups, and are not required to be pre-approved at a LWVCC annual meeting as is a formal League study.<sup>1</sup> These guidelines apply to all reports, including those prepared pursuant to a formal League study.
- 2. The scope of proposed LWVCC reports should be pre-approved by the LWVCC Board ("Board"), with the scope narrow enough for a thorough investigation. The Board should be notified of changes to the scope.
- 3. Updates on the report, with specifics, should be provided regularly at Board meetings. The Board should be updated periodically on participants actively involved in the research and preparation of the report.
- 4. Neither opinions nor unsupported assumptions should be in a LWVCC report. Recommendations and statements in reports need justification/support in the manner of facts, not opinions, with references that are valid and reliable.
- 5. No part of the report, including drafts, should be shown to non-Board members, other than group members involved with the report, before the report has been approved by the Board. However, contacts/references may be contacted for clarification or questions and fact-checking.
- 6. While non-League members may be active participants, every report must be approved by consensus of the participating League members before being submitted to the Board for approval. References relied upon should be identified in the report.
- 7. All LWVCC reports must be approved by the Board before they can be released to the public.
